Watch for

Izhitsa most often appears in a tailed variant similar to the Latin y, and it is the letter that corresponds to the Greek upsilon and to the Latin y. Sound and company separate them: in a Russian text this letter carries /i/ or /v/, the values of и and в, and it turns up in words taken from or by way of Greek, such as мѹро and сѹходъ. A tailed form standing immediately after an o is not a letter on its own but the digraph ов, the one known as uk, which represented /u/ and from whose simplified form the modern Y comes.
